

# Bicycle Tours of Atlanta

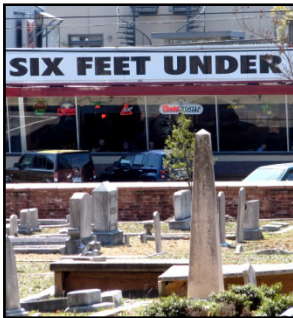
## Established Tours



The **Landmarks and Attractions Tour** is an introduction to the many things you can do while visiting this great city. A few stops along this tour include Centennial Olympic Park, Underground Atlanta, The Georgia Aquarium, The High Museum, The Carter Center, Zoo Atlanta, The King Center, Little Five Points and Turner Field. We recommend you plan your vacation activities after you finish this tour!



The **In-Town Neighborhood Tour** is the best way to learn about the many amazing options of Atlanta in-town living. If you enjoy the scenery of beautiful tree-lined streets in older established neighborhoods or if you are looking for an in-town neighborhood to call home, this is the tour for you! We bike through Inman Park, Virginia Highlands, Midtown, Cabbage Town, Grant Park and Druid Hills ... just to name a few. Discover why so many people move a short distance from the hustle and bustle of the city. You can't go wrong with this scenic and leisurely tour!



The **Old South and New Beginnings Tour** starts at the Cyclorama next to Zoo Atlanta. The Cyclorama provides a vivid retelling of the battle of Atlanta. After the 30 minute presentation, we'll tour Grant Park and then head to Oakland Cemetery, a beautiful garden cemetery founded in 1850. This is the final resting place of many Atlanta settlers, builders and noted citizens. Next we'll stop in CabbageTown, one of Atlanta's most unique bohemian neighborhoods. From there we'll make our way to the Martin Luther King Jr. Center, where you will learn about Dr. King's and Atlanta's role in the Civil Rights movement.



The **Heart of the City Tour** cycles through downtown, where we'll see many of the original structures of the city and learn of Atlanta's early history and 19<sup>th</sup> Century entrepreneurs. Included in this tour is Inman Park, the first planned suburb following the burning of Atlanta. Inman Park is filled with beautiful Victorian Homes, lush parks and exceptional dining choices. We'll also visit one of our most treasured neighborhoods, Sweet Auburn, where the childhood home of Martin Luther King Jr. still stands.



The **Midtown Tour** begins at Piedmont Park, stops in at the Atlanta Botanical Garden and takes you through gorgeous Ansley Park, one of Atlanta's oldest, most affluent and architecturally significant neighborhoods. We join Peachtree Street at the High Museum and weave our way around historical landmarks, as well as some of the most exciting and popular entertainment and dining spots near and along Peachtree Street. If you are wondering where the nightlife lives and enjoy the beautiful scenery of established neighborhoods ... then this is your tour!
